Cilmour Academy is in Gates Mills, Ohio on a **144-acre campus.** Our state-of-the-art facilities include an eight-lane pool and smaller pool area for our younger swimmers; two ice rinks; four basketball courts: three soccer fields: one turf athletic field and all-weather track; three baseball fields (one turfed): a renovated softball complex: six tennis courts: a wellness room that includes cardio and weight equipment; a full weight room; and The Lorraine and Bill Dodero Center for Performing Arts, complete with a 304-seat theater black box theater and scene shop. The south end of campus is the site of our newest addition - The Howley Commons. Campers will eat lunch there daily. Gilmour is a Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) school, so campers and campus visitors have ample Wi-Fi access.

gistration is only available through DaySmart and the registration link can be found at gilmour.org/summercamp. Families must set up an account, and register and pay for camps through the DaySmart online account. Upon registering, full payment for camp is required. Camp sizes are limited. Camp Gilmour is designed to provide campers with experiences that can only be achieved when relationships with counselors/coaches/instructors and campers can be created. Camp sizes are predetermined by counselor/coach/instructor to camper ratios with safety, facilities and logistics in mind.

nal Holidays There will be no camp on Thursday, June 19 and Friday, July 4 due to national holidays. The cost for these four-day weeks has been adjusted.

Weekly sign-up only. Registrations must be made by noon on Thursday prior to the start of camp session. This includes Before and After Care registration.

Register early. Register online by midnight on January 31, 2025 and receive a 10% discount. Please note there is no discount on camps that are in partnership with Cilmour Academy. These are marked with an * before the camp's name.

Sibling discount \$40 off second through 10th child(ren). This discount is available for all Gilmour camps through the 2025 season. This is not available for third-party camps.

Registration fees for Cilmour's Summer Camp programs that are paid online are refundable if canceled by June 1, 2025. If registration for a camp program is canceled after June 1, registration fees will be subject to the deduction of a \$100 cancellation fee. If you wish to trade your registration for another Gilmour camp, you must contact the camp director at (440) 473-8000 ext 2267. These are not automatic if the request is for a camp that has reached its enrollment capacity. Any request for cancellation due to illness or injury must be accompanied by a doctor's note.

If a camp does not have the required minimum registration, you will be contacted and have the option to exchange for another camp or receive a full refund. We do our very best to monitor these numbers and provide updates to families if a camp is in danger of being canceled.

If you hold a Camp Gilmour gift certificate, it must be redeemed for the specific camp listed on the certificate. Some of our camps are provided to Camp Gilmour through a third party; there are no discounts for these camps. They are marked with an * before the camp name.

Camp Gilmour provides lunch for most of our programs. The cost is included in your camp registration. Cilmour's food service provider, AVI, offers a hot main dish, including vegetarian options as well as a sandwich option. The menu will be provided in your Thursday email prior to your camp week. Campers are welcome to pack lunches if they do not like the choices, but are reminded not to bring items containing nuts.

Half-day programs do not include lunch. Campers who register for two half-day programs will be provided lunch and an activity between their two sessions (noon – 1 p.m.).

Camp Gilmour strives to have all campers' belongings taken home at the end of the day. In the event that something is missing, please contact the camp office so that we are able to search for the lost item. Clearly marked clothing and belongings make this easier for everyone.

Parents may not drop off their children at the Upper School or Lower School until 8:30 a.m. if they are not enrolled in Before Care.

Parents must pick up their day camper by 4:15 p.m. if they are not enrolled in After Care.

Drop-Off for Before Care and Preschool Camp is at the Lower School. Please follow signage for parking and drop-off areas. Parents should not enter the building when they drop off their camper(s).

Drop-Off for Day and Specialty Camps is at the circle (Pender Circle) outside the Athletic Center. Counselors will be there at 8:30 a.m. to greet your camper and take them to their camp groups.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up for Hockey Camps are at the Floyd E. Stefanski Ice Center. Parents are asked to check your hockey player in and out. There will be a staffer at the door to assist.

Pick-Up for Day Camp is at the circle (Pender Circle) outside the Athletic Center. In your Thursday email, you will receive a tag to put in your car. When you drive up, a counselor will go to get your camper, bring him/her to your car

and have you sign the camper out. You do not need to leave your car.

Pick-Up for Preschool Camp is at the Lower School. Parents are asked to park in the parking lot and sign out their camper at the door.

Pick-Up for After Care is at the Lower School. Parents are asked to park in the parking lot and sign out their camper at the door.

Late Drop-Off or Early Pick-Up If it is necessary to drop your camper off later than 9 a.m. or pick up before 4 p.m., the administrative assistant is available to help with these requests. Please call the Camp Line at (440) 473-8000 x2267 to make the necessary arrangements.

Before and After Care (440) 473-8000 x 6127

Before Care is available from 7:15 – 8:30 a.m. at the Lower School. This program provides a variety of activities for your child as he/she prepares for the day. Day campers will be bused to the Upper School campus at 8:30 a.m. to begin their day camp experience.

After Care is also held at the Lower School and is available from 4 – 6 p.m. Campers from the Day Camp and specialty camps are bused to the Lower School at 4:15 p.m. After Care is another opportunity for our campers to enjoy activities, play on the playground and reflect on their camp day experience. Snack is provided for After Care

Anyone who remains after 4:15 p.m. will be bused to the Lower School for the After Care program and families will be charged \$25 for the day. There is no single day or drop-in option for our Before and After Care programs. Parents must pick up their children from After Care by 6 p.m. A \$1 per minute late charge will be assessed beyond 6 p.m.

Please dress for the weather. Cooler mornings tend to give way to warmer afternoons. Dress in layers and be sure that everything is clearly marked with your camper's name. A backpack is good for keeping clothing and swimming suits and towels together.

Please apply sunscreen at home before coming to camp. Weather permitting, we try to be outside as much as possible. Counselors can assist in the application of sunscreen but cannot rub it on campers. A spray sunscreen works best for those needing assistance with application.

Water is important for daily health. Please provide an unbreakable water bottle marked with your camper's name. Campers will have many opportunities and much encouragement to drink and fill their bottles throughout the day.

There is no transportation to campus for camps. Gilmour Academy uses our own buses and vans as transportation on campus and for our weekly field trips and off-site programs. All drivers have proper credentials and have had background checks.

Additional information for camps will be sent on Thursday of the week before your camp is scheduled to begin to the email address you provide in your DaySmart registration. If your registration is received late, there may be a delay in this communication.

POTTY TRAINING POLICY

Children enrolled in Camp Gilmour must be potty trained before attending camp. Children must be able to wear underwear and have very few accidents. A child having daily accidents would not be considered potty trained. (Please note that if your child requires pull-ups, they aren't considered potty trained.)

WHY DO CHILDREN HAVE TO BE POTTY TRAINED BEFORE THEY ATTEND PRESCHOOL CAMP?

There are strict standards around changing and disposing of wet or soiled diapers with regard to licensure. Camp Gilmour does not hold this license.

We do understand that even potty-trained children will occasionally have toileting accidents. By definition, "accidents" are unusual incidents and should happen infrequently. In these instances, the senior camp counselor will help children change their clothes, encouraging independence as much as possible.

A POTTY-TRAINED CHILD CAN DO THE FOLLOWING:

- · communicate to the counselors that they need to go to the restroom before they need to go
- · alert themself to stop what they are doing to go and use the bathroom
- · pull down their clothes and get them back up without assistance
- · wipe themself after using the toilet
- · get on/off the toilet by themself
- · wash and dry hands
- · postpone going if they must wait for someone who is in the bathroom or if they are away from the

We certainly will ask your child many times throughout the day and always before snack and lunch if they need to use the bathroom. A teacher will assist children as needed, but children should be able to complete toileting activities independently. This is an issue that protects all concerned.

It is not uncommon for a child who is fully toilet trained to have a setback when they are in a new environment. Preschool Camp staff are aware of this and will assist the children when necessary. Please dress your child in clothing that can be undone and changed easily. Please send a complete change of clothes appropriate for the season. Parents will be notified if a child has a toileting accident.
